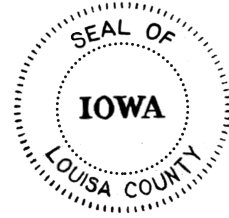

**Constitutional Amendment**

Shall the following amendment to the  
Constitution be adopted?

Summary: Provides for only U.S.  
citizens aged 18 or older and meeting  
state and county residency  
requirements to vote in all elections.  
Further provides that 17-year-olds who  
will be 18 years old by the General  
Election are eligible to vote in the  
primary election, subject to the same  
citizenship and residency requirements.

**Constitutional Amendment**

Shall the following amendment to the  
Constitution be adopted?

Summary: Provides that the lieutenant  
governor will act as the governor if there  
is a temporary disability of the governor.  
Further provides that the lieutenant  
governor or lieutenant governor-elect  
will be the governor or governor-elect in  
the case of the resignation, death, or  
permanent disability of the governor or  
governor-elect thus creating a vacancy  
in the office of lieutenant governor or  
lieutenant governor-elect, as  
appropriate.
